## Information and Media Literacy Legislation for 2022-23 School Year

Beginning with the 2022-23 school year, the Illinois legislature has amended HB0234 to require all public high schools to include a unit of instruction on media literacy and states the topics of instruction that are required. # All About the IHLS Delivery On the Go Service and Why You May Receive Some Bright Orange Bags

As many of you know, Illinois Heartland Library System's Delivery department offers a service that supplements our five-day delivery, the Delivery On the Go service. The Delivery On the Go service allows our drivers to move some interlibrary loan materials directly from one library to another library without having to take them back to an IHLS delivery hub—same route, same day. We're now making the service even easier by providing bright orange bags just for Delivery On the Go items! Instead of placing items on top of bins, exposed to the elements and relying on your route driver's memory to deliver them early, you can place such items in these protective, reusable, and recyclable orange bags.

Beginning the week of April 18, many libraries will find a stack of orange Delivery On the Go bags in delivery tubs. Please keep these bags at your library and use them any time you would like to send an item via the Delivery On the Go service, starting immediately. Libraries at the end of routes won't receive bags, as these libraries don't need them. More details on these bags are below.

## What is the IHLS Delivery On the Go Service?

Items can be delivered to your interlibrary loan patrons even faster with the IHLS Delivery On the Go service. The Delivery On the Go service enables qualifying items\* to be delivered to the receiving library that very same day. Same route, same day.

\*Delivery on the Go service deliveries are available to lending libraries when the requesting library is down-route from the item's owning library and delivery is scheduled to arrive at the requesting library later that same day.

How to Send an Item via the IHLS Delivery On the Go Service If you notice that an item you pull is for a library after you on your library's IHLS Delivery route, you can help the receiving library's patron get it faster by using the Delivery On the Go service (and others can do the same for you).



- · Grab an orange Delivery On the Go bag.
- Use a permanent marker and the lines on the back of the bag to designate which library the materials should go to. (Use the bag like you would an interoffice mail envelope.)
- Put the bag on top of your outgoing tub(s).

That's it! When our delivery driver arrives, they will pick up the bag and deliver it to the receiving library that very same day—the fastest service possible, no sorting at the IHLS hub required.

Delivery On the Go bags should be used for Delivery On the Go service only.

## How to Tell What Libraries are on Your Delivery Route

If you are wondering what libraries follow you on your route, you can find these on the IHLS website. Navigate to <a href="www.illinoisheartland.org">www.illinoisheartland.org</a> and click Delivery, then click Routes, then select your hub location (Champaign, Carbondale, or Edwardsville). All the route information is included, including your library's IHLS route number. Additionally, we will also send out copies of the route your library is on, so you know which libraries are before and after you.
