

Did you know? Law Requires Collection Development and Recension Policies for Public Libraries

Municipal and Township Public Libraries (75 ILCS 16/30-60)

Sec. 30-60. Resolution concerning library materials and facilities. The board of each district shall adopt, and review at least every 2 years, a resolution for the selection of library materials and the use of library materials and facilities. No employee may be disciplined or dismissed for the selection of library materials when the selection is made in good faith and in accordance with the resolution required to be adopted under this Section. (Source: P.A. 87-1277)

District Public Libraries

(75 ILCS 5/4-7.2) (from Ch. 81, par. 4-7.2)

Sec. 4-7.2. The board of library trustees shall establish, and review at least biennially, a written policy for the selection of library materials and the use of library materials and facilities. No employee may be disciplined or dismissed for the selection of library materials when the selection is made in good faith and in accordance with the written policy required to be established pursuant to this Section. (Source: P.A. 85-751)



Annual Certification & ILLINET Traffic Survey

Deadline: March 31

To retain system membership, each library needs to complete its annual certification for system membership between Jan. 3 and March 31, 2022. Certification is a two-step process. The first part of the two-step process is the completion of the ILLINET Interlibrary Loan Traffic Survey. The second step is to complete the Annual Certification form through the Library Directory & Learning Calendar (L2) website. The certification form verifies that the library is compliant with the membership criteria outlined in the Illinois Administrative Code.

Public libraries were sent an email on Jan. 3 that explains this year's new questions. Added by the Institute for Museum and Library Services (IMLS) and the Public Libraries Survey (PLS), these new questions provide more detailed reporting for the programming section, including live virtual programming and age-specific group programming of all types. As always, the instructions and survey itself are available on the Illinois State Library LibPAS Portal. 


