SB2125 and Required Steps for Virtual Meetings

Public Bodies of Illinois:

Senate Bill 2125 has passed in both houses of the Illinois Legislature and is expected to be signed by Governor Pritzker. This bill amends the Open Meetings Act and addresses remote participation in meetings of public bodies while under disaster proclamations. Although it is not yet law, it is expected to become effective immediately upon the governor's signature. Advice from the Attorney General's Office and the Public Access Counselor is that **these procedures should be adopted immediately.**

Attorney Phil Lenzini has outlined the following required steps for virtual meetings:

REQUIRED STEPS FOR VIRTUAL MEETINGS

Senate Bill 2135, which has passed both houses of the General Assembly, has not yet been signed by the Governor into law; however, it almost certainly will be. The legislation clarifies and provides a list of factors required to conduct virtual meetings under the Open Meetings Act, as set forth here.

- A disaster declaration by the Governor or Director of the Department of Public Health over the public body's jurisdictional area must be proclaimed. (This is currently done in the Executive Orders that have been issued.)
- The head of the public body must determine an in-person meeting is not practical or prudent because of the disaster (a plain statement to this effect before the meeting starts, copied into the meeting minutes, would suffice).
- All members should be verified and must be able to hear each other and all discussion, and for open meeting portions the public attendees also. If not, then

- alternate arrangements must be made.
- At least one member of the board, or the director or attorney, must be physically
 present at the meeting location, unless this is unfeasible due to the disaster.
- · All votes must be by roll call and so recorded.
- Notices must be posted at the site and on the website and provided to registered news media, except for bona fide emergency meetings.
- A verbatim recording (audio or video) must be made and kept of all meeting open portions and closed portions. The open portion recordings must be made available to the public.
- All costs are to be paid by the public body.

Launch date, Required unique email addresses, Data freeze, Learning reports



The L2 team continues their hard work of creating a better, more user-friendly, and more robust L2 for everyone! The launch of the new Library Directory & Learning Calendar (L2) is tentatively planned for mid-August, and we need you to act now.

All member library staff and trustees are urged to update their L2 accounts

with a unique email address before the migration of data from the current L2 to the new L2. Your account will not migrate without a unique address—one email to one person. (Public Library Trustees will still have an option to display a shared email account in the directory in lieu of their private email addresses; however, a unique email will be required for account creation purposes.)

In addition, there will be an L2 data freeze on July 31. No information will be able to be downloaded, created, or added to L2 for a period of about two weeks.

Finally, learning reports will not be migrated to the new L2. This means. . .

RAILS is making sure that libraries can retain library-level data by providing a spreadsheet to any library that requests it. This file will include the complete learning report history for all staff (past and present) for your library, which you can then break down and redistribute as needed. Individuals can also log into L2 any time before **July 31** and retrieve and save their own learning reports.



REALM Project Test 1 Study Results Released

What is the REALM Project (a.k.a. Battelle Study)?

The REALM Project, which stands for REopening Archives, Libraries, and Museums, is a research study investigating how long SARS-CoV-2, more commonly known as the coronavirus, survives on materials common to libraries, archives, and museums and how these materials can best be handled to mitigate exposure to staff and visitors. The REALM Project is conducted through a collaboration by OCLC, the Institute of Museum and Library Services, and Battelle research and development agency. What does the research say?

Phase 1: Research on High-Priority Materials and Workflows

Test 1 - Test 1 Results were published June 22, 2020. According to the findings, "scientists have found that the virus SARS-CoV-2 that causes COVID-19 is not detectable on five common library materials after three days." Materials tested: (1) hardback book cover (buckram cloth), (2) Softback book cover, (3) plain paper pages inside a closed book, (4) plastic book covering (biaxially oriented polyester film), and (5) a DVD case.

Test 2 - Currently in progress

Phase 2: Additional Research to Support Operations of Libraries, Archives, and Museums







REALM Project Test 2 Results Available

As part of the REALM Project's Phase 1 research, Battelle has conducted a study to provide information on how long some commonly handled materials would need to be quarantined prior to being returned to being put back into use.

Compared to the results of Test 1, the results of Test 2 indicate that a slightly longer quarantine time for some types of cellulose-based paper materials sitting in a stacked configuration may be required. **Read More**

OMA Changes Signed Into Law: Public Act 101-0640 (Senate Bill 2135), Government Emergency Administration Act

Several of the traditional ways we conduct library business, run our daily operations, and provide services have been dramatically impacted. **Governor Pritzker** has issued several executive orders and signed new laws to deal with the conditions of the pandemic.

One of these new laws is **Public Act** 101-0640, known as the **Government Emergency Administration Act**. (This act, before being signed into law, was discussed as Senate Bill 2135 in the article Senate Bill 2135 and Required Steps for Virtual Meetings, in which library law attorney **Phil Lenzini** discussed the changes and what they would mean for board and committee meetings held.) 

L2 Data Freeze, July 31!

The <u>new L2</u> is on target to launch in mid-August. The <u>current L2</u> will freeze late in the day on July 31, in preparation for final migration and go live. What does this mean for you? After July 31:

- Events will be visible, but will not be editable.
- Events will link to external forms of registration.
- Events from the old site will not be migrated. Future events that are already in L2 will be re-entered into the new L2.
- Learning reports will not be migrated to the new
 L2. This means that all individuals who want their learning history need to download and print their data before July 31.
- The library directory will be visible, but will not be editable.
- After we launch, we will need libraries to continue to take responsibility for their directory entries, and specifically to populate several fields that are new or impossible to migrate, such as library hours and ILL/reciprocal borrowing policies.

We encourage you to make any changes to your personal account or to your library's account (if you have elevated permissions) before the data freeze to help with information



IHLS Delivery changes interlibrary quarantine time from 72 hours to 96 hours to reflect newest scientific findings

Library staff,

IHLS would like to thank our member libraries for being partners in keeping our library staff and patrons safe during the COVID-19 pandemic. We have two announcements along these lines of which you need to be aware: **REALM Project test 2 results** and **updated tub quarantine times**.

REALM Project test 2 results released, data suggest at least 4-day quarantine

In test two of the REALM Project study, conducted by Battelle in collaboration with OCLC and the Institute of Museum and Library Services, scientists tested five common library materials held under simulated normal storage conditions (such as shelved books and stacked folders). These are the items tested and the results:

- Archival folders: virus not detectable after 2 days
- Braille paper pages: virus not detectable after 4 days
- Glossy paper pages from a coffee table book: virus not detectable after 4 days
- · Children's board book: virus not detectable after 4 days
- Magazine pages: virus was still detectable after 4 days

Updated tub handling procedures from IHLS Delivery

In response, IHLS Delivery has changed its required tub/materials quarantine from 72 hours (3 days) to 96 hours (4 days) effective immediately. Please inform your library staff and hang the updated 8.5" x 14" poster in an appropriate place in your library.





L2 Library, Employee, & Trustee Accounts Freeze July 31

Library Staff and Trustees:

Re-development of the Library Learning (L2) platform is on target for the new website launch in mid-August. In preparation for the final data migration, account data in the current L2 platform will freeze late in the day this Friday, July 31.

This means that after July 31:

Items marked with a red " *** " may need your swift attention

L2 Calendar Events & Registrations

- Events will be visible but will not be editable.
- Employees/trustees will not be able to register for events in L2 or cancel event registrations made in L2.
- Event coordinators with events listed in L2 will not be able to edit those events. Therefore, coordinators will need to add an external form of event registration (such as a Google Forms link or Zoom link) to any events that are currently taking registration. These events will also need to be re-entered into the new L2 platform after it launches.

L2 Learning Reports

- Learning reports will not be migrated to the new L2.
- *** Library employees/trustees who want their learning history will need to download their data before July 31.
- *** Library directors/equivalents and HR staff who want all of their employees' learning histories should email IHLS after July 31 for this report.

Library Directory Entries in L2

- Library directory listings will be visible but not editable.
- *** Directors/designated employees should review and update their library's listing. However, some information, such as library hours and ILL/reciprocal borrowing, cannot be migrated to the new site and will require updating after the launch of the new L2 platform.

Library Staff/Trustee L2 Accounts

- Library employee/trustee account information will be visible but not editable.
- *** Employees/trustees should review and update their account information by July 31.
- *** Employees/trustees using a shared email account (such as trustees@publiclibrary.org) will need to create a new account with their own email

address by July 31. (In the new L2, employees/trustees will have the option to hide their private address and display a shared address; however, a unique address is required for each person for account creation purposes.)

The NEW AND IMPROVED Library Learning platform is scheduled to go live mid-August.

IHLS Library Members,

In light of the increasing coronavirus positivity rates and other metrics tracked in the Restore Illinois pandemic plan, it's possible that Region 4, the Metro East Region, or another of the plan's 11 regions could move back into Phase 3. We want to assure our member libraries that IHLS Delivery will continue to operate and make deliveries should Region 4 or any region reenter Phase 3.
